


# Fall 2023 Newsletter The CASE Association

**OUR CONFERENCE PROGRAM** is designed to promote case writing through a roundtable format and interaction where case ideas emerge (embryos), cases are developed (cases without instructor manual), and cases are critiqued (cases with instructor manual) to improve their chances for

publication. The conference program is centered around developing the case writer and instructor with many networking and co-authoring opportunities. This year we will repeat the case writing hackathon experience facilitated by one of the case writing experts in the field. The exercise will allow participants the opportunity to develop cases live with other attendees. Finally, our special focus on teaching cases online will allow attendees to develop the tool kit that is sure to improve their teaching effectiveness.

We support Ph.D. students and scholars in training, practitioners (SP, PA, and IP) wanting to make a transition to full time instruction, but more importantly scholars who want to have an impact in line with AACSB International requirements.

The conference offers a great opportunity to meet colleagues and make friends. The networking opportunity is of great value. The conference is a good place to learn, apply new skills and just have fun.

Kindly note that each participant can submit only one embryo case.
- 2. *Cases without Instructor's Manual* Is your case in the developmental phase? You will be part of a roundtable providing comprehensive feedback on various aspects of your case, including guidance on creating an effective instructor's manual.
- 3. *Cases with Instructor's Manual* Have you finalized your teaching case and its instructor's manual? Benefit from insightful feedback to refine your work and prepare it for publication submission.

### **Special Conference AI Panel Discussion Planned**

GenerativeAI has received widespread media coverage and attention since the launch of ChatGPT 3.5 in November of 2022. We are sure that many of you and your institutions are in the process of creating policies governing how it might be used in the classroom. At The CASE Association, our area of focus is crystal clear - we care deeply about the development and publication of high-quality case studies in support of the learning process.

In this light, we plan to hold a panel discussion at the 2024 EAM/CASE conference in Providence to discuss what might be the appropriate use of GenerativeAI as a digital assistant in writing academic case studies. We fully expect, and welcome, a wide range of perspectives. Your feedback and participation will be used to inform The CASE Association's policy on the use of AI. We look forward to hearing your voice on this very important subject.

## News from the Case Research Journal PUBLISHING

Dear Case Associate Membership:

I would like to start by thanking you for the continued support of the Case Journal. When I took on the role of Editor-In-Chief January 2023, I was pleasantly surprised to see the high-quality cases and teaching notes coming from members of the Case Association. Reviewing your cases, the impact and value of the Case Association's conference and "Hackathon" quickly became evident. The group's willingness to serve as reviewers and provide timely, developmentally-focused feedback was also very encouraging. With your support, a few positive journal metrics year-to-date 2023 include:

- · A 25% increase in case submissions compared to 2022 (January-December);
- · A 23% increase in accepted cases compared to 2022;
- · A 10% drop in acceptance rate compared to 2022;
- · Authors from 37 countries have submitted cases compared to 24 in 2022.

Corresponding with the increased international interest in the Case Journal, we have also expanded our team of Associate Editors to include an even more diverse range of backgrounds and disciplines. In turn, we are now able to more closely match case contexts (e.g., country, target audience) with the expertise and geographies of Associate Editors. Editorial advisory board members also continue to be invaluable contributors to the journal on multiple fronts.

Moving towards the end of 2023 and into 2024, I am excited about the positive strides the Case Journal is taking with the support of the Case Association and editorial team members. Keep the cases coming!
